She has worked to integrate the library and the teaching of research skills into more aspects of the campus, including athletics, transfer student programming and the First-Year Experience program. Sarah has taught dozens of one-shot library orientation sessions to undergraduate and graduate students and teaches library research skills labs to students taking English Composition every quarter. She has also been an instructor in the CSUB FYE program for the past two years.

LOGGING IN TO THE WEBCAST

We encourage you to set the event up in a conference room or classroom from a single computer in order to allow multiple stakeholders from your campus to participate. Remember, as long as only a single computer connects, you can bring as many people as you want to the event. Because there are no travel expenses and only a single registration fee is required, each additional participant lowers the cost per person significantly. Purchasing a site connection and inviting everyone involved in a particular topic is a great way to provide cost-effective professional development. Please note that you will have the option to receive audio via your computer speakers or telephone.

If for any reason a relevant stakeholder cannot co-locate for the session, we encourage you to include that person by purchasing an additional connection at the reduced fee of \$195 per session. This will ensure that every member of a team receives the same relevant, timely information in the most efficient way. If an interested party cannot participate at the designated time, or if someone would like to view the presentation again, an archived copy of the event will be available for 60 days.
