Participants will engage in activities to practice their refined interview skills around various case examples.

Intermediate Skill #2: Advancing Your Note-Taking Skills

Interviews yield volumes of information, some of which is relevant and some of which is not. Discerning how to effectively take notes in advance, during, and after a hearing, and methods and modalities to do so will be learned. Participants will learn, practice, and critique note-taking methods and note-taking examples in case scenarios.

The final investigative report serves as the culmination of facts gathered during an investigation. Whether your institution employs a hearing board or an investigative model, a person or a group of people need a high-quality report to review facts and evidence presented by all parties, including witnesses, in the investigation. In this session, participants will practice and critique report writing. Additionally, various formats for investigative files will be discussed so participants can review their current methods and explore additional ones. From opening statements, to strategizing questions, to tips for storing or analyzing evidence, participants will have an informed practice for formatting and storing confidential investigative files.

Writing factual analyses in the final investigative report is an effective strategy for decision makers. In this session, attendees will participate in activities to identify the undisputed and disputed facts from the mock investigations, in an impartial manner, to include in the report. Additionally, participants will be briefly reintroduced to the basic concept of credibility. Using one of the fact patterns supplied in the workbook, as well as additional facts, participants will assess information that relates to an interviewee's credibility and practice writing an appropriate credibility assessment.
