# Communication Sciences & Disorders at Augustana College

#### Why CSD?

CSD training prepares students for careers in audiology, speech-language pathology, speech science, hearing science, health care, education, and sales of clinical, education and health-related materials.

### Why Augustana?

Augustana's program is the only CSD program in Illinois that focuses solely on undergraduate education. Components of the major include substantial clinical experience, research and service learning—all with the close support of the CSD faculty.

CSD majors recieve training as student speech-language pathologists or audiologists working with clients in Augustana's Center for Speech, Language, and Hearing. At this on-campus clinic, Augustana provides intervention to approximately 85 families a term; CSD majors perform most clinical services, supervised by CSD faculty who hold the Certificate of Clinical Competence from the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association.

The center's facilities in the Betsey Brodahl Building house the classroom and student-clinician workroom, seven assessmentintervention rooms, an audiology suite, two research labs, a conference room and faculty offices.

Augustana CSD majors have been selected to present their research findings at the national convention of the American Speech-Language-Hearing Association every year for the past 10 years. For more than 25 consecutive years, CSD majors have presented at annual state conventions.

#### Internships and career preparation

Along with their training in the on-campus Center for Speech, Language, and Hearing, Augustana CSD grads are successful because of their experience in performing data-based research, a final thesis and professional class presentation for the Senior Inquiry capstone project.

Every year, 95-100% of Augustana CSD graduates who apply to graduate programs are admitted—and half of those who go on to graduate school receive teaching or research fellowships in their advanced programs.
